



VILLAGE OF QUEEN CHARLOTTE SEWER TREATMENT PROPERTY PURCHASE

ADVANCE ELECTOR REGISTRATION

Are you eligible to vote at the Sewer Treatment Property Purchase assent voting on February 24, 2018?

If you are not sure you can find out if you are on the current list of electors by calling or visiting the Village of Queen Charlotte office, 903 A Oceanview Drive, 250 559 4765. The office is open from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday to Friday (excluding holidays).

Advance elector registrations will be accepted at the Village of Queen Charlotte office until **4:30 pm on January 2, 2018**. With the exception of registrations on voting days, elector registrations will not be accepted during the period January 3, 2018 to February 25, 2018.

ELECTOR QUALIFICATIONS

RESIDENT ELECTORS:

- 18 years of age or older on general voting day for the assent voting; and
- a Canadian citizen; and
- a resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration; and
- a resident of the Village of Queen Charlotte voting area for at least 30 days immediately before the day of registration; and
- not disqualified under the Local Government Act or any other enactment from voting in an election or assent voting and not otherwise disqualified by law.

NON-RESIDENT PROPERTY ELECTORS:

- 18 years of age or older on general voting day for the assent voting; and
- a Canadian citizen; and
- a resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration; and
- a registered owner of real property in the Village of Queen Charlotte voting area for at least 30 days immediately before the day of registration; and
- not entitled to register as a resident elector; and
- not disqualified under the Local Government Act or any other enactment from voting in an election or assent voting and not otherwise disqualified by law; and
- **if there is more than one registered owner of the property, only one of those individuals may, with the written consent of the majority of the owners, register as a non-resident property elector.**

MAIL BALLOT VOTING

THE FOLLOWING ELECTORS ARE PERMITTED TO VOTE BY MAIL BALLOT AND TO REGISTER TO VOTE BY MAIL:

- those persons who have a physical disability, illness, or injury that affects their ability to vote at another voting opportunity; or
- persons who expect to be absent from the Village of Queen Charlotte on general voting day and at the times of all advance voting opportunities.

REQUESTING A MAIL BALLOT PACKAGE:

Before 4:00pm on February 2, 2018 you must submit the following information to the Village of Queen Charlotte office by mail to PO Box 580, 903 A Oceanview Drive, fax 250 559 4742 or email office@queencharlotte.ca:

1. Full name;
2. Residential address;
3. Address of the property in relation to which you are voting (for non-resident property electors);
4. Method of delivery of your mail ballot package:
 - (a) pick up at Village of Queen Charlotte office;
 - (b) regular mail through Canada Post to residential address; OR
 - (c) regular mail through Canada Post to an alternate address provided when requesting the mail ballot package; and
5. If you are not on the list of electors, to ensure you receive the correct registration application form in your package, you must indicate whether you are going to be registering as a resident or non-resident property elector.

Mail ballot packages will be sent out commencing on or about December 18, 2017. To be counted, your mail ballot must be received by the Chief Election Officer no later than 8:00 pm on February 24, 2018.
